#### <u>INSTRUCTION</u>

## **High School Graduation Requirements**

The board will establish graduation requirements which, at a minimum, satisfy those established by the State Board of Education. The board will approve additional graduation requirements as recommended by the superintendent or designee. Graduation requirements in effect when a student first enters 9<sup>th</sup> grade will remain in effect until that student graduates. The board will award a regular high school diploma to every student enrolled in the district who meets the requirements of graduation established by the district. Only one diploma will be awarded with no distinctions being made between the various programs of instruction which may be pursued.

A total of twenty-two (22) credits shall be required for graduation from high school through the Class of 2020; twenty-four (24) credits shall be required beginning with the Class of 2021. High school credit will be awarded for successful completion of a specified unit of study.

A student who completed high school courses before attending high school must be given high school credit that applies to high school graduation requirements, unless requested otherwise by the student and the student's parent/guardian.

# Requirements for Graduating

Each student must meet the following requirements to graduate from high school:

- Complete the credit requirements;
- Demonstrate career and college readiness by completing a high school and beyond plan; and
- Meet the requirements of at least one graduation pathway option described in the procedure accompanying this policy.

**Personalized Pathway Requirement (PPR)** are related courses that lead to a specific post high school career or educational outcome chosen by the student based on the student's interests and High School and Beyond Plan, which may include Career and Technical Education, and are intended to provide a focus for the student's learning.

## <u>Implementation</u>

The superintendent or designee will develop procedures to implement this policy according to state law. The procedures will include, but not be limited to, publication of graduation requirements, high school completion, subject area requirements and credits, waiver of graduation requirements, other credit options, and graduation ceremonies.

A student shall be issued a diploma after completing the district's requirements for graduation. A student will also be advised that he/she may receive a final transcript.

No student who has completed the requirements for graduation shall be denied a diploma as a disciplinary measure, but he/she may be denied participation in graduation ceremonies when personal conduct so warrants. Such exclusion shall be regarded as a school suspension. Any student who willfully creates a disturbance at graduation will have their diploma held until appropriate disciplinary consequences are fulfilled.
