The District will provide opportunities for all students to develop the knowledge and skills essential to meeting the following four student learning goals established by the state of Washington. These goals will be placed within the context of a standards-based education system in which high standards are set for all students.

- 1. Read with comprehension, write with skill, and communicate effectively and responsibly in a variety of ways and settings;
- 2. Know and apply the core concepts and principles of mathematics; social, physical, and life sciences; civics and history; geography; arts; and health and fitness;
- 3. Think analytically, logically, and creatively, and to integrate experience and knowledge to form reasoned judgments and solve problems; and
- 4. Understand the importance of work and how performance, effort, and decisions directly affect future career and educational opportunities.
